Trail for Northern Arm

The town was looking to create a route for a mountain biking trail. The project required using a GIS software (QGIS) to map out a proposed path for the trail.

The trail mapped in the software is made using points and lines:

Points: The points are the corners of the trail.

Lines: The lines are connecting each of the points to make the shape of the trail.

The land survey was placed on top of the map as shown



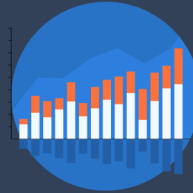

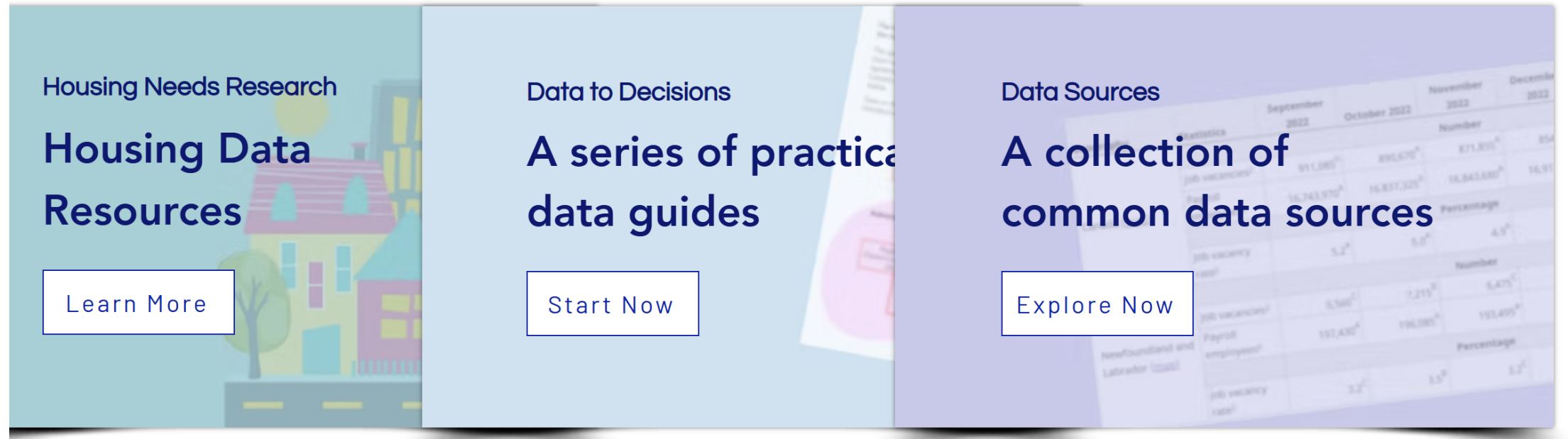
