MUNICIPAL FISCAL STABILITY

Reignite municipal-provincial fiscal framework advocacy + support research on alternate sources of revenue.

EQUITY, DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

Lead municipal reconciliation and anti-racism efforts + promote, encourage, and support greater equity, diversity and inclusion across the sector.

COMMUNITY HEALTH AND SAFETY

Support members to address health and safety challenges in their communities through research and advocacy + lead sector-wide housing and public transportation conversations.

CLIMATE RESILIENCE

Revitalize climate change and climate resilience conversations as per historical MNL work in this area + use and update the 7-steps toolkit as foundation.

Rainbow Registered - Process

- Make application through the CGLCC - There is a cost based on # of employees (year 1 covered by ACOA)
- Agree to an assessment through an independent assessor



Rainbow Registered - Process

- Accreditation assessment focuses on four key criteria:
- ✓ Policies and practices
 - ✓ Training
 - ✓ Commitment to inclusive leadership
 - ✓ Culture of inclusivity



Rainbow Registered - Benefits

- It communicates to potential/current residents that this is a safe and inclusive community
- For local businesses – it can aid in attracting skilled labour, and customers



Regional Transportation Feasibility Study

- Joint initiative of Killick Coast Communities
- Aligns with broader provincial policy objectives that promote:
 - ✓ Regional economic development
 - ✓ Municipal cooperation



Regional Transportation Feasibility Study

- Feasibility study will look at:
 - ✓ Need and demand / fare structure and sustainability models
 - ✓ Route maximization / capital asset acquisition
- Communities will develop public engagement framework with input from Consultant
 - ✓ Workshop in each community
 - ✓ Online survey
- Having the feasibility study allows access up to \$10m from Rural Transit Solutions Fund

Regional Transportation Facilitates...

 - ✓ Essential services
- Economic Development
 - ✓ Supports local economies
- Support for vulnerable populations
 - ✓ Seniors, low income...
- Environmental benefits
 - ✓ Reduced emissions

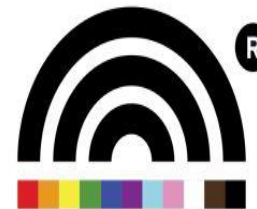
- Immigration settlement coordinator on staff to develop this resource in partnership with OIM
